

Avaya G430 Branch Gateway, Release 8.0

Voluntary Product Accessibility Template (VPAT)

The Avaya G430 Branch Gateway can be administered via a graphical user interface or via a text-only command line interface. The responses in this document refer to the command line interface, and assume that the administrator's terminal or terminal emulation software is fully conformant with the statutory requirements of Section 508.

All functions are executable from the keyboard. All system responses are presented in standard ASCII text. |

Applications also shall not disrupt or disable activated features of any operating system that are identified as accessibility features where the application programming interface for those accessibility features has been documented by the manufacturer of the operating system and is available to the product developer. | Supports | The Avaya G430 Branch Gateway command line interface does not disrupt or disable the accessibility features of operating systems, nor does it disrupt or disable the features or settings of other software applications. |

| 1194.21(d) Sufficient information about a user interface element including the identity, operation and state of the element shall be available to assistive technology. When an image represents a program element, the information conveyed by the image must also be available in text. | Supports | The Avaya G430 Branch Gateway command line interface does not use images to convey information. All information is presented as standard ASCII text. |
| 1194.21(e) When bitmap images are used to identify controls, status indicators, or other programmatic elements, the meaning assigned to those images shall be consistent throughout an application's performance. | Supports | The Avaya G430 Branch Gateway command line interface does not use bitmap images or other graphical representations. All information is presented as standard ASCII text. |

The minimum information that shall be made available is text content, text input caret location, and text attributes. | Supports | The Avaya G430 Branch Gateway command line interface presents all information as standard ASCII text. The prompt at the input caret location displays the following information: the equipment type (in this case the associated media gateway type, G430), the media gateway number (e.g., 005), and the user's permission level (e.g., super). |

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| 1194.21(g) Applications shall not override user selected contrast and color selections and other individual display attributes. | Supports | The Avaya G430 Branch Gateway command line interface is text-only. The color and contrast settings are controlled by the user's terminal emulation software. |
| 1194.21(h) When animation is displayed, the information shall be displayable in at least one non-animated presentation mode at the option of the user. | Not Applicable | The Avaya G430 Branch Gateway command line interface is text-only. There is no animation. |
| 1194.21(i) Color coding shall not be used as the only means of conveying information, indicating an action, prompting a response, or distinguishing a visual element. | Supports | The Avaya G430 Branch Gateway command line interface does not use color coding. |

Microphones shall be capable of being turned on and off to allow the user to intermix speech with TTY use. | Supports | The Avaya G430 Branch Gateway has industry standard RJ-11 analog ports that permit direct connection of standard TTY devices. There is no aspect of the G430 that would disrupt the ability of a microphone-equipped device to support the intermixing of speech and TTY use. |
| 1194.23(b) Telecommunications products, which include voice communication functionality, shall support all commonly used cross-manufacturer non-proprietary standard TTY signal protocols. | Supports | <p>The Avaya G430 Branch Gateway is able to detect the presence of non-voice audio tones on the non-IP side of the gate, identify the type of device being used (FAX, modem, or TTY), and then automatically enable the appropriate method for transporting those signals within IP networks. A variety of administrator-selectable methods for the transport of TTY signals is provided.</p> <p>In one approach, the G430 can encode and transmit analog 45.45 baud Baudot TTY tones (the TTY format most commonly used in the US) and 50 baud Baudot tones (a format commonly used outside of the US in countries such as Australia, Ireland, and the UK) as redundant RFC2833-format IP packets that, in essence, contain verbal descriptions of the tones rather than the tones themselves. Avaya gateways that receive these descriptive packets are able to reconstruct the original analog TTY tones. (Independent testing has verified that this approach provides reliable transport of TTY signals with packet loss rates up to 10%, even when G.729 compression is being used on the audio channels.)</p> <p>The G430 also supports a G.711 “pass-through” approach similar to that used by other manufacturers. An RFC2198 option allows a packet to carry a redundant payload from previous packets along with the current payload. (This approach requires more network bandwidth than the RFC2833-based method, but may be preferable when support for non-Baudot TTY protocols is required. Please note also that the pass-through mode provides higher quality when endpoints are synchronized to the same clock source.)</p> <p>In cases where modem, FAX, and TTY tones are not detected correctly by the G430 due to the use of older and/or non-standard equipment, the system administrator can configure an analog station specifically to be modem, FAX, or TTY by setting the “VoIP Endpoint Type” field to the corresponding value in the station form. Calls to and from this station will enter pass-through mode automatically, without the gateway taking time to detect in-band tones, and then identifying the media to be transported and how it should be processed.</p> <p>Interoperability with non-Avaya equipment is supported when signals are encoded in G.711 voice mode, with all proprietary mechanisms set to OFF on the administrator’s “ip-codec set” form.</p> |

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| 1194.23(c) Voice mail, auto-attendant, and interactive voice response telecommunications systems shall be usable by TTY users with their TTYs. | Supports | The Avaya G430 Branch Gateway's automated attendant feature supports the presentation of TTY menus and announcements. The G430 does not have an inherent voicemail or IVR capability. (Please note that extensive TTY support is provided by the Avaya voicemail and IVR platforms that would be used in conjunction with the G430). |
| 1194.23(d) Voice mail, messaging, auto-attendant, and interactive voice response telecommunications systems that require a response from a user within a time interval, shall give an alert when the time interval is about to run out, and shall provide sufficient time for the user to indicate more time is required. | Supports | The time-out period and behavior of the Avaya G430 Branch Gateway's automated attendant feature is controlled by the associated Avaya Communication Manager server. The G430 does not have an inherent voicemail or IVR capability. (Please note that the Avaya voicemail and IVR platforms that would be used in conjunction with the G430 conform to this requirement). |
| 1194.23(e) Where provided, caller identification and similar telecommunications functions shall also be available for users of TTYs, and for users who cannot see displays. | Not Applicable | There is no aspect of the Avaya G430 Branch Gateway that would interfere with the conformance of a properly equipped endpoint device. |
| 1194.23(f) For transmitted voice signals, telecommunications products shall provide a gain adjustable up to a minimum of 20 dB. | <p>1194.23(k)(1) Products which have mechanically operated controls or keys shall comply with the following: Controls and Keys shall be tactilely discernible without activating the controls or keys.</p> | <p>Not Applicable</p> | <p>There is no aspect of the Avaya G430 Branch Gateway that would interfere with the conformance of a properly equipped endpoint device.</p> |
| <p>1194.23(k)(2) Products which have mechanically operated controls or keys shall comply with the following: Controls and Keys shall be operable with one hand and shall not require tight grasping, pinching, twisting of the wrist. The ability to change the size, color, and font of the text is dependent on the administrator’s terminal emulation software. |
| 1194.31(c) At least one mode of operation and information retrieval that does not require user hearing shall be provided, or support for assistive technology used by people who are deaf or hard of hearing shall be provided. | Supports | <p>The Avaya G430 Branch Gateway command line administrative interface does not have an audio component.</p> <p>The manner in which the Avaya G430 Branch Gateway automated attendant function supports end users who are deaf or hard of hearing is documented in the response to 1194.23(c).</p> |
| 1194.31(d) Where audio information is important for the use of a product, at least one mode of operation and information retrieval shall be provided in an enhanced auditory fashion, or support for assistive hearing devices shall be provided. | Supports | <p>The Avaya G430 Branch Gateway command line administrative interface does not have an audio component.</p> <p>The manner in which the Avaya G430 Branch Gateway automated attendant function supports end users who are deaf or hard of hearing is documented in the response to 1194.23(c).</p> |
| 1194.31(e) At least one mode of operation and information retrieval that does not require user speech shall be provided, or support for assistive technology used by people with disabilities shall be provided. | Supports | No mode of operation or information retrieval in the Avaya G430 Branch Gateway requires user speech. |
