Some pages in the Subscriber Options application do not display properly if the Windows option for high contrast is enabled: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Greetings • Fax Access
1194.21(h) When animation is displayed, the information shall be displayable in at least one non-animated presentation mode at the option of the user.	Not applicable.	There are no animations.
1194.21(i) Color coding shall not be used as the only means of conveying information, indicating an action, prompting a response, or distinguishing a visual element.	Supported.	
1194.21(j) When a product permits a user to adjust color and contrast settings, a variety of color selections capable of producing a range of contrast levels shall be provided.	Supported.	
1194.21(k) Software shall not use flashing or blinking text, objects, or other elements having a flash or blink frequency greater than 2 Hz and lower than 55 Hz.	Supported.

1194.22(b) Equivalent alternatives for any multimedia presentation shall be synchronized with the presentation.	Not applicable.	The product does not feature any such multimedia presentations.
1194.22(c) Web pages shall be designed so that all information conveyed with color is also available without color, for example from context or markup.	Supported.	
1194.22(d) Documents shall be organized so they are readable without requiring an associated style sheet.	Supported.	
1194.22(e) Redundant text links shall be provided for each active region of a server-side image map.	Not applicable.	There are no server-side image maps.
1194.22(f) Client-side image maps shall be provided instead of server-side image maps except where the regions cannot be defined with an available geometric shape.	Not applicable.	There are no client-side image maps.
1194.22(g) Row and column headers shall be identified for data tables.	Supported with exceptions.	Column headings are identified, but row headings are not. The scope of headings is not identified. The Manage Local Subscribers and Manage Remote Subscribers pages display data that has the appearance of a table, but is actually preformatted text without HTML structure.
1194.22(h) Markup shall be used to associate data cells and header cells for data tables that have two or more logical levels of row or column headers.	Not supported.	The Sort and Filter Local Subscribers and Sort and Filter Remove Subscribers pages have two levels of column headings, but do not use appropriate markup.
1194.22(i) Frames shall be titled with text that facilitates frame identification and navigation.	Supported with exceptions.	Frames are titled, but the titles indicate their position on the screen rather than their function.
1194.22(j) Pages shall be designed to avoid causing the screen to flicker with a frequency greater than 2 Hz and lower than 55 Hz.	Supported.	
1194.22(k) A text-only page, with equivalent information or functionality, shall be provided to make a web site comply with the provisions of this part, when compliance cannot be accomplished in any other way. The content of the text-only page shall be updated whenever the primary page changes.	Not supported.

All electronic forms can be navigated by tabbing, however some are organized as tables, and the lack of the markup noted in (l) and (m) means that users of assistive technology may not receive the directions and cues necessary to easily understand the purpose of all elements on the form.
1194.22(o) A method shall be provided that permits users to skip repetitive navigation links.	Supported.	Navigation links are in their own frame, so a user can skip to the next frame to avoid presenting them.
