

Avaya Aura® System Platform 6

Voluntary Product Accessibility Template (VPAT)

Avaya Aura System Platform provides a common, browser-based interface for installation, updates and upgrades of Avaya Aura applications.

Following its initial introduction, there have been continuous improvements in Avaya Aura System Platform 6, as designated by version numbers such as 6.1, 6.2, and 6.3. The statements in this document apply to all versions of Avaya Aura System Platform 6.

Although other screens and browsers may be supported, the statements in this document apply only to the screens that are commonly accessed by system administrators, using Microsoft Internet Explorer, Version 8 or above, or Mozilla Firefox, Version 18 or above.

<p>1194.21(a) When software is designed to run on a system that has a keyboard, product functions shall be executable from a keyboard where the function itself or the result of performing a function can be discerned textually.</p>	Does not support	<p>Not all product functional functions can be executed via the keyboard. Not all functions provide text feedback when executed.</p> <p>Note also that on some pages, there is an automatic screen refresh every ten seconds. If a user accesses a function on this screen by “tabbing” to it, and then fails to execute the function prior to the automatic refresh, the function that had been selected by the user will no longer have focus.</p>
<p>1194.21(b) Applications shall not disrupt or disable activated features of other products that are identified as accessibility features, where those features are developed and documented according to industry standards. Applications also shall not disrupt or disable activated features of any operating system that are identified as accessibility features where the application programming interface for those accessibility features has been documented by the manufacturer of the operating system and is available to the product developer.</p>	Supports	<p>The System Platform interfaces do not disrupt or disable the accessibility features of operating systems, nor do they disrupt or disable the features or settings of other software applications.</p>
<p>1194.21(c) A well-defined on-screen indication of the current focus shall be provided that moves among interactive interface elements as the input focus changes. The focus shall be programmatically exposed so that assistive technology can track focus and focus changes.</p>	Supports with exceptions	<p>On some pages there is an automatic refresh every ten seconds. If a user accesses a function on this screen by “tabbing” to it, and then fails to execute the function prior to the automatic refresh, the function that had been selected by the user will no longer have focus.</p>
<p>1194.21(d) Sufficient information about a user interface element including the identity, operation and state of the element shall be available to assistive technology. When an image represents a program element, the information conveyed by the image must also be available in text.</p>	Supports with exceptions	<p>Some of the System Platform pages, such as those for Backup/Restore and Patch management, have sub-menus that do not comply.</p>
<p>1194.21(e) When bitmap images are used to identify controls, status indicators, or other programmatic elements, the meaning assigned to those images shall be consistent throughout an application's performance.</p>	Supports	<p>Bitmap images have the same meaning throughout.</p>

<p>1194.21(f) Textual information shall be provided through operating system functions for displaying text. The minimum information that shall be made available is text content, text input caret location, and text attributes.</p>	<p>Supports with one exception</p>	<p>One of the System Platform pages presents graphs in which text is embedded within images. (Note: All of the information that is presented in this manner may be exported into a spreadsheet as text only.)</p>
<p>1194.21(g) Applications shall not override user selected contrast and color selections and other individual display attributes.</p>	<p>Supports</p>	<p>System Platform does not override the contrast, color, or individual display attributes that are selectable via the operating system preferences or via the browser preferences.</p> <p>(Note: The operating system and browser preference settings apply only to text and not to images, such as the graphs that are presented by System Platform.)</p>
<p>1194.21(h) When animation is displayed, the information shall be displayable in at least one non-animated presentation mode at the option of the user.</p>	<p>Supports with exceptions</p>	<p>The System Platform web pages use an animated progress indicator. This mode of presentation cannot be disabled by the user.</p>
<p>1194.21(i) Color coding shall not be used as the only means of conveying information, indicating an action, prompting a response, or distinguishing a visual element.</p>	<p>Supports</p>	<p>In all cases where color is used for conveying information, it is accompanied by a change in the image that is discernible without color vision.</p>

1194.31(a) At least one mode of operation and information retrieval that does not require user vision shall be provided, or support for assistive technology used by people who are blind or visually impaired shall be provided.	Does not support	Some functions are not accessible from the keyboard and are therefore not operable without vision.
1194.31(b) At least one mode of operation and information retrieval that does not require visual acuity greater than 20/70 shall be provided in audio and enlarged print output working together or independently, or support for assistive technology used by people who are visually impaired shall be provided.	Supports with exceptions	Text and images can be made larger via the web browser settings.
1194.31(c) At least one mode of operation and information retrieval that does not require user hearing shall be provided, or support for assistive technology used by people who are deaf or hard of hearing shall be provided.	Supports	User hearing is not required in order to operate the System Platform.
1194.31(d) Where audio information is important for the use of a product, at least one mode of operation and information retrieval shall be provided in an enhanced auditory fashion, or support for assistive hearing devices shall be provided.	Not applicable
